Objectives

Upon completion, the participants should be able to:

- Understand the perceptions and themes of Twitter posts about marijuana use in pregnancy
- Understand whether patient-assessed evaluation of postpartum bleeding differs in women who receive immediate postpartum contraception with the levonorgestrel intrauterine device (IUD), women who receive immediate postpartum contraception with the etonogestrel subdermal implant and women who receive no contraception throughout the first six weeks postpartum or the duration of lochia
- Assess the effect of induction of labor on cesarean rates in patients with obesity
- Review the common pregnancy complications associated with obesity
- Understand adherence to evidence-based treatment of intra-amniotic infections (IAI) before and after implementation of cefoxitin as first line treatment
- Understand how group prenatal care influences rates of breastfeeding at hospital discharge
- Understand how group prenatal care influences breastfeeding knowledge and self-efficacy
- Identify factors negatively affecting the utilization of first trimester prenatal care
- Discuss the limitations of prenatal diagnosis with increased body mass index
- Analyze historical attempts to improve this issue
- Review results from thesis project "Panniculus retractor use for visualization of fetal anatomy: A randomized controlled trial"
